Horse Judging

Recently several Hale County 4-Hers participated in District competition for both Horse and Dairy Cattle Judging. The Horse Judging Contest was held at West Texas A&M University in Canyon, TX and the Dairy Judging Contest was held in Canyon at Hinders Dairy.

There were four teams that participated in the Horse Judging Contest. Just like most other 4-H competitions there are three different age divisions in the Horse Judging event. Competing in the junior division was: Bracken Alexander, Layne Mustian, Sterling Skinner and Colti Wright. Placing in the Halter Division of the contest was Layne Mustian 1st overall, Sterling Skinner 2nd overall, and Colti Wright 6th overall. In the Performance Division Sterling Skinner was 1st, Colti Wright and Layne Mustian were tied for 6th and Bracken Alexander was 10th. High individuals overall were Sterling Skinner 1st, Layne Mustian was 4th, Colti Wright was 7th and Bracken Alexander was 11th high point overall individual. The junior team placed 1st in the Halter Division, 1st in the Performance Division and the team finished 1st high team overall.

Hale County 4-H had two Intermediate team's and they consisted of: Team 1; Katie Cox, Chantal Flores, Kennady Johnson and Mackenzi Mull. Team 2 consisted of: Brooklyn Mason, Treyton Peterson, Emmy Powell and Emily White. Placing individually in the Halter Division was: Mackenzi Mull 1st, Katie Cox 5th and Chantal Flores was 9th. In the Performance Division Hale County placed individually as follows: Kennady Johnson 4th and Chantal Flores and Treyton Peterson were tied for 8th. Overall as an individual for Hale County 4-H Kennady Johnson was 3rd, and Chantal Flores was 7th. Team 1 of the Hale County Intermediate team's placed 1st high team and team 2 was 7th high team in the Halter Division. Team 1 placed 5th high and team 2 placed 6th high team in the Performance Division. Overall team 1 placed 4th and team 2 placed 7th high teams of the District 2 Horse Judging Contest.

Competing in the Senior Division was: Katie Barnes, Jessi Cheyne, Letti Cheyne and Will Wright. Placing individually in the contest in the Halter Division was: Letti Cheyne 6th, Will Wright was 8th, Jessi Cheyne 9th and Katie Barnes was 10th. In the Performance Division Katie Barnes was 3rd, Jessi Cheyne placed 4th, Will Wright was 6th and Letti Cheyne placed 12th. In the reasons division; Jessi Cheyne placed 2nd, Will Wright placed 3rd, Katie Barnes was 4th and Letti Cheyne placed 8th. Overall individual placings were as follows: Jessi Cheyne won 4th place overall, Katie Barnes placed 5th, Will Wright was 6th and Letti Cheyne won 9th high point individual overall. The senior team placed 3rd high as a team in the Halter Division, 1st high team in the Performance Division, 1st in Oral Reasons and 1st high placing team overall and earned the opportunity to travel to state competition in College Station during the month of June.

Meats Judging Results

Competing for Hale County 4-H in Meat Judging also at Texas Tech University in Lubbock was: Steven Ebeling, Kristin Miller, Logan Mustian, Kristen True and Landon Woods. Logan Mustian competed as an individual in the Intermediate division and the other kids were a team in the Senior Division.

In the intermediate division in the placing classes Logan Mustian placed 2nd. In retail identification Logan placed 4th and ended up as 4th high point individual overall.

In the senior division in the placing classes Kristen True

placed 1st, Landon Woods placed 2nd, Steven Ebeling placed 3rd and Kristen Miller placed 4th. In the Retail ID division Steven Ebeling placed 1st, Kristen True placed 2nd, Kristin Miller placed 3rd and Landon Woods received 4th. Livestock Judging Results

Recently three teams competed at the District 2 Livestock Judging Contest in Lubbock at Texas Tech University. There were twelve 4-Hers who participated to represent Hale County 4-H.

The livestock judging competition consists of four species of animals- swine, cattle, sheep and goats that the kids must evaluate and rank. This years contest had the following classes: Performance Angus Bulls, two market steer classes, one market lamb class, one breeding ewe class, one market goat class, one breeding gilt class and one class of market hogs. There are four animals in a class, and each 4-Her judge must place them in order from 1 to 4 the way he or she thinks they should be ranked. Then their placing is compared to an official placing for each class to determine how well each 4-Her did compared to the official judges.

The junior teams consisted of Team one: Karlee Hegi, Cassidy Hegi, Katie Mahagan and Samantha Sullivan. Team two was: Reece Hastey, Hagen Offield and Nathan Sullivan. Katie Mahagan was 1st, Reece Hastey placed 5th and Samantha Sullivan placed 18th overall in the Sheep and Goat division. Placing individually in Swine was: Cassidy Hegi 5th high individual and Katie Mahagan was 7th high individual. Placing individually in Beef Cattle were: Katie Mahagan 1st and Hagen Offield placed 16th in cattle. Katie Mahagan placed 1st high overall of the entire Junior contest. The Junior team #1 was 6th place in the Sheep and Goat division, 4th place in the Swine division, 4th place in Beef Cattle and 5th high team overall. The Junior team #2 from Hale County 4-H was 10th in Sheep and Goat, 11th in Swine, 10th in Beef Cattle and 11th high team overall.

Representing Hale County 4-H in the Intermediate division was a team of: Key Lutrick, Kyle Mahagan, Madi McKay and Logan Mustian. Kyle Mahagan was 18th and Key Lutrick was 25th individual in Swine. Placing in the Beef Cattle division was: Kyle Mahagan 10th and Logan Mustian 11th high individual. In the Sheep and Goat division Logan Mustian was 7th and Kyle Mahagan was 8th high individual overall. In the overall individual contest Kyle Mahagan placed 4th high overall and Logan Mustian placed 8th high overall. Hale County Intermediate team placed 2nd high team in Sheep and Goat, 8th high team in Swine and 5th high team in Beef Cattle. The Hale County 4-H Intermediate Team placed 2nd high team overall of the entire contest.

Ashley Shaw judged as an individual in the Senior division of the Livestock Judging Contest. Ashley placed 23rd in Beef Cattle, 21st in Swine, 18th in Sheep and Goat and 15th in the Reasons division. Ashley ended up placing 17th high point individual overall of the Senior division of the District 2 Livestock Judging Contest.

Congratulations to all 4-Hers who participated in this years District 2 Livestock Judging contest. Let's come back and try even harder next year. Thanks to all producers who allowed Hale County 4-H to come and practice evaluating your livestock throughout the year.
