There are a few new changes, so please be sure to read your livestock project information below.

State Fair Market/Breeding Lambs & Goats:

- Market projects that have been State Fair validated must be re-validated for Spring Majors.
- **New validation requirement!!** State Fair of Texas is requiring validation for registered breeding sheep, registered breeding goats, wether/commercial dams, and wether/commercial does. <u>Please read about the new validation changes here</u>.

State Fair Swine:

- Projects that have been State Fair validated must be re-validated for Spring Majors.
- New Validation Changes for State Fair and Heart of Texas Swine Projects:
 - Crossbred gilts showing at the State Fair of Texas and Heart of Texas MUST be validated.
 - State Validation tags must be in the pig's ear when it enters the holding pens. This means tags cannot be in the hand or pocket. Any pig entering the holding pen without a tag will not be allowed to show.

Market Steers:

- Tag fee has increased due to eliminating nose prints and relying more on DNA testing for steer identity.
- There is only one period for steer tag order and physical validation. Once physically validated in June, steers are eligible for Fall Fairs and Spring Majors.

Breeding Heifers:

- There are two tag order and physical validation periods.
 - Spring Once physically validated in June, heifers are eligible for Fall Fairs and Spring Majors for two years.
 - Fall Once physically validated in October, heifers are eligible for Spring Majors and the next year's Fall Fairs for two years.
- Heifers validated this spring or last fall remain eligible (and do not need to be revalidated) for the remainder of her show career unless a change is made to breed or ownership.

Texas 4-H Horse Validation must be done on 4-H Connect. Validation and payment is required of ALL horses regardless if they were validated last year. Before you begin your validation process, you must: have digital photos of your horse(s) from front, left side, and right side. These photos must be accessible for upload during the validation process. For registered horses, you need to have a PDF copy of your horse(s) registration papers for upload.
