4-H Livestock Projects Swine Project Tips

- 1. Walk pigs daily.
- 2. Always have fresh water
- 3. Clip hogs before arrival at county show using a #1A or #2 guard.
- 4. Stalls at County Show are preassigned so use only your pen.
- 5. Brush pigs daily (Keep Clean and Dry)
- 6. Weigh pigs once per week

Beef Tips

- 1. Do not forget hoof trimmings
- 2. Rinse and blow hair often
- 3. Keep head clipped (this helps grow hair)
- 4. Feed hav daily
- 5. Practice showing

Sheep & Goat Tips

- 1. Halter train lambs & goats
- 2. Keep sheep close sheared
- 3. Keep lambs covered
- 4. Exercise lambs as needed
- 5. Practice showing











