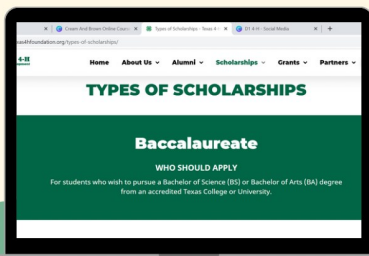

6. Work directly with all Superintendents of the show.
